Health Risks from RF Radiation Telecommunication towers emit radiofrequency (RF) radiation, a type of non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation . While non-ionizing radiation does not directly damage DNA like ionizing radiation, studies suggest chronic exposure may increase oxidative stress, DNA damage, and potentially cancer risk . Children are particularly vulnerable due to thinner skulls and developing organs, absorbing higher levels of RF radiation . Some studies, such as the Bavarian Study and research in Germany, indicate higher health risks for residents living within 300-400 meters of towers, including earlier onset of certain cancers . Regulatory Guidelines and Safety Recommendations Regulatory bodies like the FCC and ICNIRP maintain that RF exposure from cell towers is well below safety limits, but critics argue these limits are outdated and do not account for long-term biological effects . Independent organizations recommend precautionary measures, such as maintaining a distance of 400-500 meters from towers, especially near schools and homes . Guidelines like EUROPAEM EMF 2016 suggest stricter exposure limits for sensitive individuals, highl...
