

Avoid staircases near electrical boxes



Overview

CPSC warns that consumers can be electrocuted when they use ladders near overhead wires. Many overhead power lines are not insulated. Electrical clearances are the minimum separation distances the National Electrical Code (NEC) requires between wiring, panels, overhead conductors. Section 240. As long as the required working space can be maintained, a panelboard could be installed on a stairway landing as it would not be located over the “steps of the stairway.
