

Cable management frame sequence

Cable management frames should be installed and sequenced by type, size, and routing path to ensure organized, accessible, and maintainable cabling. General Principles When managing cables in a frame or rack, the sequence and organization are critical for maintenance, airflow, and system reliability. Start by positioning drawers or panels to allow sufficient space for cable routing on the top, bottom, and between units. Avoid placing shorter drawers between longer ones to maintain consistent cable paths (). Sequencing by Cable Type and Size Communications cables (e.g., serial attached SCSI, InfiniBand, PCIe) should be installed first, starting with the smallest diameter cables and progressing to larger ones. This ensures that smaller cables are not crushed or obstructed (). Power cables should be routed using the innermost cable-management bridge lances, while communications cables use the middle lances. The outermost lances can be used for additional routing if needed (). Use vertical cable managers for front and rear routing, separating patch leads from backbone or trunk cabling. Detachable doors and finger bars help manage copper and fiber patch leads (). Frame Assembly and Mounting Two-post or four-post frames are typically used, with heights up to 45U. Frames are often supplied flat-packed and assembled using bolts and captive nuts (). For FTTH or access point installations, adjustable frames can rotate on a pole mount, allowing practical cable winding and minimizing visibility (). Ensure proper grounding and earthing points are used for shielded systems (). Routing and Retention Use cable raceways on the sides of the rack to manage excess power cables (). Route cables from one side of the rack to the other using top bridge lances when possible. For fiber installations, use spools or reels to store excess cable and maintain bend radius (). Best Practices Label all cables and note the sequence order, especially when a specific plugging sequence is required for concurrent maintenance ().
