

Cable tray cover plate fastening techniques

Cable tray cover plates can be fastened using screws, clamps, buckles, press plates, or padlocks depending on the tray type and installation conditions. Common Fastening Methods

- Buckle Fixing** The cover plate is held by bending folds at both ends of a buckle. This method is generally suitable for horizontal installations, but vertical installations may risk the cover slipping.
- Padlock or Seven-Shaped Buckle Fixing** For high-security or specialized applications, padlocks or uniquely shaped buckles can be used to prevent unauthorized removal or accidental dislodging of the cover.

Installation Tips Always pass screws through the inner side of the tray to avoid damaging cables and secure them with combination nuts on the outer side. For mesh or perforated trays, ensure clamps or screws are compatible with the tray type. When cutting trays, re-drill connector perforations if necessary to maintain proper fastening points. Use edge protection strips at cut edges to prevent cable damage if joint plates or end plates are not installed. Follow manufacturer-specific instructions for pre-mounted turn buckles on bends, tees, or crossovers to ensure proper alignment and load support...
