Fasteners must be compatible with the tray material, and connections should allow for expansion and contraction. Support and Spacing Support elements such as wall brackets, ceiling suspensions, and center-hung supports are used to hold trays in place. Maximum support spacing typically ranges from 1.5 to 3.6 meters, depending on tray type and load. Each hanger has a load capacity, often between 318 kg (700 lbs) and 340 kg (750 lbs), which must not be exceeded. Grounding and Bonding Metal cable trays must be properly grounded to ensure electrical safety. Bonding jumpers should be installed across tray sections to maintain continuity. Aluminum trays should not be used as equipment grounding conductors for circuits exceeding 600 amperes. Grounding ensures compliance with NEC Article 392 and prevents electrical hazards. Cable Management in Wells When routing cables through a cable well, maintain minimum bend radii to prevent damage, and use ties or straps to organize cables by voltage and function. Leave slack for future adjustments and thermal exp...
