Fusion Splicing: Uses heat to fuse the ends of two fibers, creating a continuous optical path with minimal signal loss. Mechanical Splicing: Aligns fiber ends and holds them together with a connector, which is faster but may have slightly higher loss than fusion splicing.

Before splicing, cables are prepared by stripping, cleaning, and polishing the fiber ends to ensure optimal light transmission. After splicing, fibers are carefully organized in splice trays, and excess fiber is coiled to maintain proper bend radius and prevent damage...
