

Can there be wire connectors inside the cable tray



AI Overview

Wire connectors can be placed inside cable trays, but only under specific conditions and following proper grounding and bonding practices.

Placement of Wire Connectors
Cable trays are designed to support and route electrical conductors, and it is generally permissible to have wire connectors or splices inside the tray as long as they do not compromise safety or violate NEC requirements. Multi-conductor cables with individual equipment grounding conductors (EGCs) can be installed in the tray, and connectors may be used to join conductors within the tray system.

Grounding and Bonding Considerations
If an EGC is installed in or on the cable tray, it should ideally be bonded to each or alternate tray sections using grounding clamps. This ensures that under fault conditions, the magnetic forces do not dislodge the conductor from the tray. Bare copper conductors should not be placed in aluminum trays due to the risk of electrolytic corrosion; insulated conductors are recommended, with insulation removed only at bonding points using tin or zinc-plated connectors.

NEC Compliance
The NEC allows cable trays to serve as the EGC in qualifying facilities, but the tray itself must meet minimum cross-sectional area requirements for the intended fault current rating. Steel trays should not be used as EGCs for circuits with ground-fault protection above 600 amperes, and aluminum trays should not be used above 2000 amperes. All metallic trays must be grounded according to NEC Article 250.96, regardless of whether they are used as EGCs.

Practical Recommendations
Ensure connectors and splices are mechanically secure and do not obstruct cable routing. Use insulated conductors for bonding in aluminum trays. Bond EGCs to tray sections to maintain electrical continuity. Verify that the tray and connectors meet NEC cross-sectional and material requirements for the system's fa...

Cables and conductors must be secured to the cable tray at intervals according to installation instructions. For non-horizontal runs, cables should be fastened securely to transverse
