Terminal Blocks and Bus Bars: Provide organized connections for neutral and earth conductors. Wiring a Lighting Switch Circuit Power Isolation: Turn off the main breaker before starting any work. Circuit Planning: Decide which lights will be controlled by each switch and assign a dedicated breaker for each lighting group. Cable Routing: Run cables from the distribution box to the switch and then to the light fixture. For modern installations, a three-conductor cable is recommended to bring the neutral to the switch box. Switch Connection: Connect the live wire from the breaker to the switch input and the switch leg to the light fixture. The neutral wire typically bypasses the switch and connects directly to the light. Grounding: Ensure all metal boxes and fixtures are properly ear...
