This technique is often used to repair a line that has been accidentally cut, or to extend an existing cable run to reach a new device location. Because coaxial cable is engineered to maintain. Coaxial cable splicing is the technique of repairing cut or damaged coaxial cable—most commonly RG6 type used in satellite dish installations—by preparing clean ends, attaching compatible F-type connectors, and joining them with a female-to-female barrel coupler (also known as an F81 splice). A coax cable splice joins two separate lengths of coaxial cable so that the combined run functions as a single continuous cable.
