A 42U rack is the most widely used globally, providing 73.5 inches of usable vertical space, while 48U racks are increasingly deployed for maximum capacity.

Rack DepthDepth is critical for fitting equipment and ensuring proper airflow. Standard depths include:

- Shallow racks (24–27 inches): Suitable for patch panels, AV equipment, and network switches
- Medium racks (36 inches): Common for general-purpose servers and network gear
- Deep racks (42–48 inches): Required for enterprise servers, GPU systems, and storage arrays

When selecting depth, consider the full chassis length, cable management, and rear clearance for airflow, typically adding 4–6 inches beyond the equipment depth.

Special VariantsWhile 19-inch racks dominate, other formats exist for niche applications:

- 23-inch telecom racks: Common in European telecom systems
- Open Compute Project (OCP) 21-inch racks: Used in hyperscale data centers
