

Cut methods for various bends in cable trays

Cut only the necessary wires or side rails to allow the tray to bend without compromising structural integrity. Use a bending tool or clamp to achieve a smooth 90° turn. Vertical Bend (Up/Down Bend) Similar to horizontal bends, but the tray is bent vertically. Cut wires selectively to allow upward or downward movement while maintaining support for cables. Tee (T-Junction) Bend Cut a section of the tray to create a branch. Ensure the cut edges are deburred and the junction is reinforced with clamps or brackets to maintain stability. Cross Bend (4-Way Junction) Requires cutting intersecting sections of the tray. Align the trays carefully and secure with clamps or splice plates to maintain load-bearing capacity. Offset Bend (Side Shift) Cut the tray to allow lateral displacement. Bend the tray gradually to avoid sharp kinks, ensuring cables can pass smoothly through the offset.
