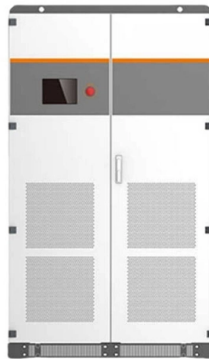


Distribution boxes must not be blocked

The code requires that the working space must be readily accessible, meaning it cannot be blocked by furniture or require the use of a key to gain access. Even items like plumbing pipes, air ducts, or other non-electrical equipment cannot project more than 6 inches into the 36-inch deep working.
