Check that connectors are clean and properly seated. Dirty or misaligned connectors can prevent light transmission, resulting in no output. Verify that the remote device is powered on and compatible with the link speed. Use Diagnostic Commands Run the following to check port and transceiver status: `show interface status` - confirms if the port is administratively up or down. `show interfaces transceiver detail` - checks Tx/Rx power, temperature, and voltage. Low or missing Rx power may indicate a broken fiber or dead transmitter. `show idprom interface` - reads EEPROM/vendor info to confirm module recognition.
