

Drilling holes in cable tray shafts

Use mounting slots and brackets to secure components without overloading the tray. Follow industry standards such as BS EN 61537, BS 6946, NEC, NEMA, and IEC for safe installation and structural support. Avoid cutting structural building members to accommodate trays, and do not mix cutting blades between different metals to prevent galvanic corrosion.

Best Practices Drill holes only where necessary for cable routing or mounting. Remove any burrs after drilling to prevent cable damage. Plan hole placement in advance to maintain tray integrity and compliance with electrical and safety standards. For offshore or high-voltage installations, consider shielding and crosstalk effects when determining hole size and placement.
