

Fiber Optic Terminal Box in Low Voltage Well

Insert the stripped fiber into the splice tray and splice it with the pigtails using fusion splicing. Protect the splices with fiber sleeves inside the tray. Route the spliced pigtails to the adapters on the upper side of the tray and connect them securely.

Step 5: Connect Drop Cables After splicing and testing, connect the pigtails to the drop cable connectors. Ensure all connections are stable, free from sharp bends, and properly labeled for future maintenance. Use strain relief features such as fixing ribs or cable ties to secure the cables.

Step 6: Testing and Verification Gently pull on the fibers to ensure they are stable and do no...
