Top of the Distribution BoxThe top section of a household distribution box typically accommodates the incoming main power line from the utility supply. This area often includes the main switch or main circuit breaker, which controls the entire electrical system of the home. In some designs, the top may also house indication lights or monitoring modules in smart DB boxes to show the status of the mains supply. Adequate space is reserved for the bending radius of incoming wires, especially if the wire size exceeds 10 square millimeters, to prevent stress and ensure safe connections.

Bottom of the Distribution BoxThe bottom section is generally used for outgoing circuits that distribute power to various parts of the home, such as lighting circuits, room socket circuits, and high-power appliance circuits. Each circuit is connected to a circuit breaker or fuse, which protects against overloads and short circuits. The bottom area must provide enough depth to accommodate the maximum depth of switches and terminal connections, with additional clearance for safe wiring and maintenance.

Dimensions and Layout ConsiderationsFor boxes handling lighting circuits or small power loads, the width is calculated by summing the switch widths plus 20 mm on each side, the height is the switch height plus 40 mm, and the depth is the maximum switch depth plus 10 mm. For boxes with more than 20 switches or larger incoming wires, two rows of switches may be required, with width and height adjusted accordingly, while maintaining proper depth for wiring and terminal connections. Proper installation ensures the box is level, plumb, and securely mounted, with no gaps around the edges and anti-corr...
