

How much space should be reserved before the cable enters the cable tray

Single-conductor cables: Install in circuit groups to prevent inductive heating; maintain at least one cable diameter spacing between adjacent cables of the same circuit for ampacity purposes.

Unsupported spans: Do not exceed 6 feet without additional supports to prevent mechanical stress on cables.

Support and Stability Support spacing: Standard trays require supports every 6–10 feet, while heavy-duty trays can span up to 20 feet depending on load.

Vertical or angled runs: Secure cables to transverse members to maintain spacing and prevent sagging.

Power cables rated 600V or less and Class 2 or Class 3 signal cables may share a tray if separated by a fixed barrier or if the power cables are

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Flextray load and fill recommendations

The NEC rule requires that the cable cross-sectional areas together may not exceed 50% of the tray area (width x depth = fill). Cables will nearly completely fill the cable tray when reaching the 50%
