Use a fiber cleaver to make a precise, flat cut at the end of the fiber. Prepare the Pigtail Remove the protective coating from the bare end of the pigtail. Clean the fiber thoroughly to ensure no contamination. Splicing Fusion Splicing: Align the bare fiber of the pigtail with the incoming fiber in a fusion splicer.
