

How to connect optical module link aggregation



AI Overview

To connect optical modules using link aggregation, install compatible transceivers, connect multiple fiber links, and configure LACP on both ends to form a single logical channel.

Step 1: Prepare Hardware and Fiber Links Ensure both network devices (switches, routers, or optical modules) support link aggregation and LACP (IEEE 802.3ad standard) for automatic negotiation. Install compatible SFP/SFP+ optical transceivers in the ports you plan to aggregate. Use matched fiber cables (single-mode or multi-mode) to connect the transceivers between devices. Step 2: Configure Link Aggregation on Devices Access the device management interface (CLI or web GUI). Create a Link Aggregation Group (LAG) and assign the physical ports connected via fiber to this group. Enable LACP on the LAG to allow automatic negotiation and ensure both ends agree on the aggregated link. Configure additional settings if needed, such as load balancing mode (e.g., based on MAC, IP, or TCP/UDP ports) to optimize traffic distribution.

Step 3: Verify and Test the Aggregated Link Check the link status on both devices to confirm all member ports are active and participating in the LAG. Test bandwidth and redundancy by transferring data across the aggregated link. LACP ensures that if one link fails, traffic is automatically rerouted through remaining active links. Optionally, monitor traffic distribution and error statistics to ensure proper load balancing and link health.

Step 4: Best Practices Use identical transceivers and fiber types for all aggregated links to prevent mismatched speeds or errors. Keep port configurations consistent on both ends, including speed, duplex, and VLAN settings. Document the LAG configuration and port assignments for easier troubleshooting and future expansion.
