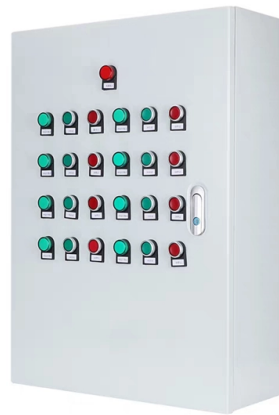


How to connect the drop cable to the fiber optic splice box

To connect a fiber optic drop cable to a splice package, carefully prepare the cable, separate the fiber and messenger subunits, and perform either fusion or mechanical splicing while following proper routing and safety procedures.

Step 1: Safety and Preparation Always wear safety glasses and gloves when handling fiber optic cables, and work in a well-ventilated area if using solvents. Identify the fiber subunit (usually printed) and the messenger subunit (strength member). Cut a small hole in the web at the end of the cable using a utility knife, tilting the blade slightly toward the messenger to avoid damaging the fiber subunit. Expose the fiber by carefully stripping the outer jacket and buffer layer using dedicated fiber strippers. Handle the strength member (FRP or metallic) by straining and isolating it with insulation tape or enamel to prevent splinters.

Step 3: Splicing the Fiber
Fusion Splicing: Align the fiber ends in a fusion splicer, which melts the glass ends together for a permanent, low-loss connection. This method is preferred for long-term reliability.
Mechanical Splicing: Insert the fiber ends into a mechanical splice sleeve, which aligns them physically. This is faster but slightly less durable. Clean the fiber end-face before splicing using lint-free wipes or fiber cleaning tools to prevent signal loss.

Step 4: Routing and Securing in the Splice Closure Route the fiber subunit inside the splice closure, leaving enough length for the coupling coil and proper bend radius. Attach the messenger subunit to the hardware using approved clamps (e.g.,...
