5. Protective Devices and Standards: Ensure the box can house all required protective devices such as MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, fuses, and surge protection devices. Compliance with local standards (IEC, NEC, BS 7671, UL) is essential for safety.
6. Type of Supply System: Determine whether the system is single-phase or three-phase, AC or DC, and the earthing system. This affects the internal layout and busbar configuration.

- List all circuits with their voltage and amperage requirements.
- Calculate total load and select a main breaker rating accordingly.
- Determine the number of slots needed for all breakers, including spares for future expansion.
- Check physical space to ensure the box fits the installation area and allows proper wiring.
