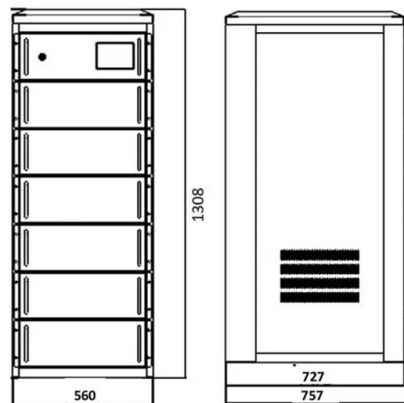


How to distinguish the colors of fiber optic cable splices

- Match colors:** Align fibers of the same color from the incoming cable to the pigtail or outgoing cable.
- Use buffer tube colors:** In high-count cables, the outer buffer tube may have a color that identifies a group of fibers, while individual fibers inside follow the 12-color sequence.
- Ribbon cables:** Fibers are arranged in ribbons, and each ribbon follows the standard color order, making it easier to match fibers during splicing.

Connector and Jacket Colors

Connector and jacket colors also provide identification cues:

- Single-mode fibers:** Typically yellow jackets.
- Multimode fibers:** Orange for 62.5/125 μm , aqua for 50/125 μm laser-optimized fibers.
- Connectors:** Color-coded to indicate fiber type and polish style, e.g., blue for PC, green for APC.

- Use a color reference chart:** Keep a printed or digital TIA-598-C color chart for quick identification.
- Work under proper lighting:** Bright, neutral lighting helps distinguish similar colors.
- Label fibers:** For complex or high-density cables, labeling e...
