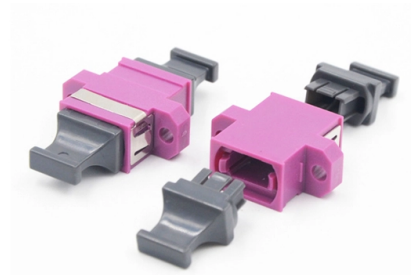


How to identify fiber sequence in optical cables

Inner Fiber Color Sequence Inside multi-fiber cables, each fiber is color-coded in a 12-color repeating sequence. This sequence is critical for splicing, patching, and troubleshooting. The standard 12-color order is:

Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate (Gray), White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose (Pink), Aqua (Light Blue).

For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats in bundles or tubes, often with additional markings (stripes or rings) to distinguish repeated sets.

Connector and Boot Color Connectors also follow color conventions to indicate fiber mode and polish type:

- Single-mode UPC: Blue
- Single-mode APC: Green
- Multimode: Beige, Aqua, or other colors depending on the OM type.
