Bend wires at right angles to buses or breakers to maintain a neat appearance and prevent stress on connections. Labeling Label each cable clearly at both ends using a permanent marker or tags. Indicate the circuit it serves, such as “Kitchen A,” “Bath B,” or “2nd Floor Lights”. Proper labeling ensures you can quickly identify circuits during maintenance or troubleshooting. Connecting to Breakers and Busbars Snap all breakers onto the busbars before terminating wires to visualize spacing and accommodate larger two-pole breakers. Use appropriately sized cable connectors for each knockout; larger feeder cables may require insulated bushings to protect insulation. Connect each circuit's neutral and ground wires to their respective bars, and hot wires to the breakers. Consider using a comb busbar for safer and more efficient power distribution.
