

How to secure cables on a distribution box

Cables should be secured within 12 inches of the distribution box and supported at regular intervals using staples, cable ties, or straps that do not damage the cable. **Safety First** Before handling any cables, turn off the power at the main breaker and verify with a voltage tester that the wires are de-energized. Use protective plates if cables pass through wood framing less than 1.25 inches from the edge to prevent nail or screw penetration. **Wire management inside the box:** Strip wires carefully, connect to terminals (phase, neutral, ground), and arrange neatly to allow heat dissipation and easy maintenance. **Additional Tips** Leave a small coil of cable inside the box for future adjustments or repairs, but ensure it does not exceed code limits. For exposed or high-risk areas, consider conduits or raceways for added protection. Always test insulation and circuit continuity after securing cables to ensure proper connections and safety.
