

How to wire an old-style electrical box or distribution box

- Wire Routing and Binding:** Route wires neatly inside the box, keeping left for incoming and right for outgoing circuits. Use cable ties to secure wires, leaving space for heat dissipation and avoiding sharp edges.
- Labeling:** Clearly mark each circuit for easy identification during maintenance or troubleshooting.

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
