

How to wire the fiber optic cable low-voltage box

Pull Tension: Do not exceed the maximum pulling force; use cable lubricant and proper pulling grips to prevent damage (). Routing: Run fiber and low-voltage cables through separate conduits or maintain proper spacing from power lines to prevent interference (). Termination: Use a fusion splicer or connector kits to terminate fiber ends accurately (). Ensure low-voltage cables are properly terminated with keystone jacks or patch panels ().

Securing Cables: Use cable ties or Velcro straps to secure cables inside boxes without crushing them. Avoid over-tightening.
