

Inspection Standards for On-site Distribution Boxes

On-site distribution boxes must be installed and inspected according to strict standards covering location, height, wiring, grounding, and compliance with NEC and IEC safety requirements.

Installation Location and Height Distribution boxes should be installed in locations that are both practical and accessible, with final positions confirmed through on-site observation and design approval. The standard installation height from the floor is generally 1.5 meters for distribution boxes and 1.8 meters for distribution boards, though adjustments can be made for operational convenience if approved. Consistency in height across multiple boxes in the same area is required for safety and aesthetics.

Leveling and Structural Integrity Boxes must be level and stable. Permissible vertical deviations are 1.5 mm for boxes under 50 cm and 3 mm for boxes 50 cm or taller. Entry and exit holes for cables should be smooth, burr-free, and fitted with insulating bushings. Surface-mounted conduit connections must be tight and secure, using locknuts to prevent wire exposure.

Wiring Standards Internal wiring should be neat, horizontal or vertical, and aesthetically arranged. Bends must have a radius at least six times the wire diameter, and wires should be tied into bundles to prevent slack. For three-phase four-wire systems, standard color codes must be followed: Phase A – Yellow, Phase B – Green, Phase C – Red, Neutral – Light Blue, Protective Earth – Yellow/Green bi-color. Yellow/Green wires must not be used for other purposes.

Connections and Grounding All wire-to-terminal connections must be firm and tight, using spring washers where required. Protective earth connections are critical; loose or missing connections can make the metal enclosure live during faults, posing a serious shock hazard. Proper grounding and earthing practices are essential to protect personnel and equipment.
