Proper mounting height: NEC recommends panelboards not exceed 6 feet 7 inches above the floor for the highest breaker, ensuring accessibility . Organized internal layout: Use modular mounting rails and structured wiring to prevent internal obstructions and facilitate inspection . Environmental protection: Use enclosures with waterproofing, dust resistance, and secure locking to prevent accidental interference .
