IP Ratings:

For example, IP5X provides dust resistance, while IP6X ensures dust-tight enclosures. Water protection can range from IPX1 (drip-proof) to IPX7 (temporary submersion).

NEMA Ratings:

In the U.S., NEMA 1 enclosures are suitable for indoor use, protecting against incidental contact and falling dirt, but not water. Outdoor Level 1 boxes may require higher NEMA ratings (e.g., NEMA 3R) for rain and snow resistance.

IEC 61439 Compliance

Level 1 distribution boxes should comply with IEC 61439, which governs low-voltage switchgear and controlgear assemblies. Compliance involves:

- Design Verification:** Simulating thermal, electrical, and mechanical stresses to ensure safe operation under full load.
- Routine Verification:** Inspecting assembly quality and critical junctions during manufacturing.
- Type Testing:** Laboratory tests for dielectric strength, short-circuit withstand, and environmental resistance.
