

Mobile Fiber Optic IPv6 Router Setup

If separate from IPv4, disable any IPv4 sync option and input IPv6 credentials manually. For Static IPv6, enter the fixed IPv6 address, subnet, and gateway as provided by your ISP. Some routers support Prefix Delegation, which allows the router to assign unique /64 subnets to VLANs or LAN segments automatically.

Step 5: Configure LAN and Client Addressing Decide how devices will receive IPv6 addresses: SLAAC (automatic) or DHCPv6 (managed). If using Prefix Delegation, the router can assign subnets to multiple VLANs or LAN segments. Optionally, configure Unique Local Addresses (ULA) for internal network use and NAT66 if required.

Step 6: Save and Reboot Save the configuration and reboot the router to apply changes. Verify that connected devices receive IPv6 addresses and can access IPv6-enabled websites.

Step 7: Troubleshooting If devices do not receive IPv6 addresses, check that the WAN connection is properly configured and that the router's firmware is up to date.
