Wiring Connections: Live/Phase wire connects from the distribution box or switch to the fan's live terminal. Neutral wire connects from the distribution box to the fan's neutral terminal. Ground wire (green or bare) must connect to the fan's metallic body and the grounding terminal in the distribution box.

Switch and Control: Fans can be controlled via a single-pole switch, timer switch, or two-way switch. For fans with capacitors or multiple speed settings, follow the manufacturer's wiring diagram carefully.
