Work must be performed by qualified electricians, and unauthorized modifications are prohibited by law. The Technical Connection Conditions (TAB) of the grid operator dictate how the box connects to the public electricity grid. For underground distribution systems, such as those fed from pad-mounted transformers, utility companies like Oncor require adherence to minimum specifications, including proper easements, conduit routing, and coordination meetings before construction. Installation must follow the latest building and safety codes, and all components should be UL/CE-certified. Proper placement is critical: boxes should be installed in dry, accessible areas with good v...
