

Requirements for the crossing distance between pipes and cable trays

Protective measures such as stainless steel trays, insulation, or anti-corrosion boards are recommended at intersections to safeguard cables.

Practical Recommendations

Ensure cable trays are not installed directly above thermal or corrosive pipes unless necessary, and always maintain the minimum distances. In constrained or complex layouts, a professional evaluation should be conducted to confirm safety distances and compliance with local standards. Maintain adequate tray length at intersections (e.g., 2 meters of protection tray for heat or corrosive pipes) to prevent cable damage.
