- Easy to Shop:** Items must be accessible to customers without digging or rearranging .
- Easy to Dispose of:** Packaging should be recyclable or easy to break down to reduce waste-handling costs .

Structural and Durability Requirements Secondary boxes must withstand the rigors of the supply chain:

- Compression Strength:** Boxes should meet standards like ASTM D642 to ensure they can handle stacking pressures during storage and transport .
- Distribution Performance:** Compliance with ASTM D4169 ensures packaging can endure vibration, impact, and environmental conditions throughout the distribution cycle .
- Standardized Sizes:** Uniform case dimensions facilitate palletization, automated handling, and co...
