

Roof Distribution Box Installation Height Requirements

- Accessibility:** The box must be easily reachable for inspection, maintenance, and emergency operation. Adequate clearance around the box is required for safe access.
- Environmental Protection:** Avoid wet or dusty areas. Outdoor boxes should have sufficient IP/NEMA ratings (e.g., IP55) to resist water and dust ingress.
- Safety:** Ensure the box is away from potential physical damage, and provide proper grounding, insulation, and secure mounting.
- Maintenance:** Position the box so that internal components like breakers, busbars, and terminal blocks are easily accessible for repairs or upgrades.

Standards Compliance

- BS 7671 and IEC 60364-5-52:** Specify that distribution boards must be readily accessible and installed at heights that allow safe operation and inspection.
- IEC 61439:** Governs the design and construction of low-voltage switchgear, ensuring that installation height and clearances meet safety and performance requirements
