- Cleave the Fiber:** Use a precision cleaver to create a flat, perpendicular end on both fibers. This ensures minimal signal loss during fusion.
- Fusion Splicing:** Place the fibers into the fusion splicer. The splicer aligns the fibers and melts them together using an electric arc, forming a continuous optical path.
- Protect the Splice:** After fusion, cover the splice with a heat-shrink sleeve or protective tube to prevent mechanical damage.
- Testing:** Verify the splice quality using an optical power meter or OTDR to ensure low insertion loss and high return loss.

Best Practices

- Always use factory-terminated pigtails rather than field-terminating connectors to reduce signal loss and improve reliability.
- Keep the work area clean and dust-free, as even small particles can degrade...
