- 3. Stud Fasteners:** Stud solutions, such as Hilti's X-ST GR, X-BT, S-BT HL, and F-BT, are threaded studs fixed directly to steel using powder-actuated tools or welding techniques. These provide fast, strong, and corrosion-resistant fixing without the need for access to both sides of the steel.
- 4. Brackets and Hangers:**
 - Vertical wall brackets:** For mounting trays vertically, typically for widths ≥ 150 mm.
 - Central hangers:** For suspending trays from ceilings or beams, compatible with various tray widths and depths, using threaded rods (6–12 mm) depending on tray size.
 - Base fixing plates:** Flush-fit trays to flat surfaces, providing 15 mm clearance for uneven surfaces.

Materials and Corrosion Protection

Fasteners are commonly made from pre-galvanised steel, hot-dip galvanised steel, Dacromet-coated steel, or stainless steel. Selection depends on environmental conditions and required corrosion resistance. Stainless steel is preferred for high-humidity or outdoor installations.
