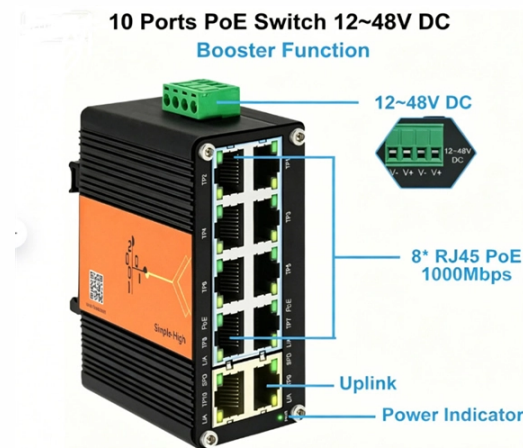

Unplug Devices: Disconnect all appliances and electronics on the affected circuit. Reset the breaker and plug devices back in one at a time to identify any faulty or high-draw appliance.

Check GFCI Outlets: If the circuit includes bathrooms, kitchens, garages, or outdoor outlets, press the RESET button on any GFCI outlets, as a tripped GFCI can cause the breaker to trip.

Redistribute Load: Move high-power appliances to different circuits to prevent overloads.
