- Reconfigure Devices:** Forget the old network on each device and reconnect to the new router. For Apple devices, this is particularly important to avoid cached network conflicts.
- Firmware Updates:** Ensure the router and any connected devices have the latest firmware to prevent compatibility issues.
- Test Connectivity:** Use a laptop or smartphone to ping devices on the network or access their admin panels to confirm proper routing.
