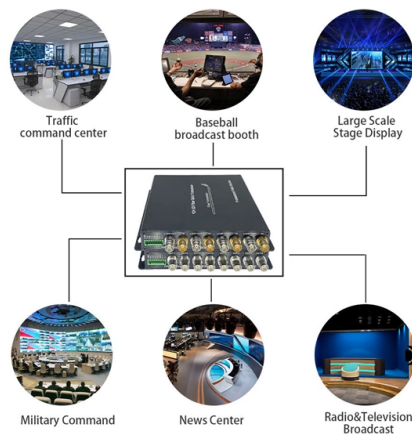


The yellow wire inside the ASS fiber optic cable
