

What are the standards for laying optical cables

Use cable breakaway devices to ensure pulling tension does not exceed rated limits. Minimize mechanical pressure at crossing points, especially for armored cables.
- 3. Environmental and Protective Measures** Keep protective material on reels until installation; for outdoor cables exposed for more than 24 hours, additional protection is required. Avoid pulling cables over sharp edges or rough surfaces; ensure the installation area is free of objects that could damage the cable. Respect maximum installation and storage temperatures specified in the cable datasheet.
- 4. Vertical and Long-Term Installations** Clamp vertical cables at frequent intervals to prevent the cable weight from exceeding the maximum recommended long-term load. Ensure residual tension after placement is below the cable's long-term load rating.
