Applications 2-core multimode cables are commonly used in: Local Area Networks (LANs) and data centers for horizontal cabling and short-reach connections. Backbone connections within buildings or between floors where high bandwidth is needed over moderate distances. High-speed Ethernet applications, supporting data rates from 1 Gbps up to 100 Gbps depending on the multimode grade (OM1-OM5).

Cost-effective: Multimode fibers are cheaper to produce and use less expensive optical transceivers than single-mode fibers.
