How It Works Data is transmitted as pulses of light generated by a laser or LED. These light pulses travel through the fiber core, bouncing off the cladding due to total internal reflection, and are received at the other end by a photodiode that converts the light back into electrical signals. This method allows for minimal signal loss and high reliability, making optical cables ideal for critical applications. Types of Optical Cables Single-mode fiber (SMF) – Has a small core (~9 microns) and supports long-distance, high-speed transmission by allowing only one light mode to propagate. Multimode fiber (MMF) – Has a larger core and supports multiple light modes, suitable for shorter distances and high-bandwidth applications. Plastic Optical Fiber (POF) – Flexible and inexpensive, typically used for short-range connections like home audio systems, but with higher signal loss per meter. Toslink – A consumer-level optical cable for digital audio, providing noise immunity and galvanic isolation, commonly used in home entertainment systems.
